



The different child and family services provided by Child Link are designed to offer the proper support to children in need. We understand situations concerning adolescents are always individually unique. We take pride in providing the best quality care plan for each adolescent whether that means traditional foster care. youth counseling, or adoption services.





Finding a "forever home" for the children in our care is our primary objective. Child Link coordinates nofee adoption services for prospective parents, through our foster-to-adopt program, following thorough background checks and home studies.

We consistently outperform similar agencies throughout Cook County in providing permanency care through adoption or quardianship. We ensure that our children are placed in the best possible family situations providing each child the opportunity to thrive.

Before we being adoption proceedings, Child Link investigates each child's placement options to mitigate unplanned future disruptions.

Child Link provides foster care to children in Cook, Will and DuPage counties of Illinois. Our foster care program finds homes for children who lack stable support systems.

Over the past three years, our foster care program has grown from 18 to 35 case managers, who partnered with approximately 350 family homes. In 2022 we served 440 children. providing them with the quality of care they need and deserve.






FOSTER CARE CONTINUED

ADOLESCENT Foster care

We work with teenagers and young adults, between the ages of 12-21, who often suffer from traumatic experiences and lack positive adult influences or role models.

Young adults in our program receive services that promote stable relationships, protection from victimization and help in developing healthier life habits and goals. Our program provides the support necessary for them to graduate high school, attend college, and build longer term positive relationships.



Interested In Becoming A Foster Parent?

Fostering is one of the most selfless things a person can do. It is an amazing way to give back to the community and to give children who have not had a great start in life, a chance for something better.

As soon as we ensure you meet all of the eligibility requirements, our staff will work with you to complete the required free training and help you obtain a foster-care license. After training and licensing are complete, children can be placed in your home.



TRANSITIONAL INTERPRETATION AND INTERPRETATION AND

We assist young women, 17-21 years old, who are transitioning from foster care to independence. We equip them with the the social. professional, and self-sufficiency skills needed to succeed on their own. We help them understand the importance of continuing education to help them achieve their goals.





Child Link's counseling program supports families and youths in our community by giving them the tools to adopt useful behaviors and habits that they will carry with them for the rest of their lives. Our skilled clinicians work with a variety of issues including anxiety disorders, attention deficit disorders and attachment concerns.

The children we serve are often directly and indirectly impacted by violence in their environment, including domestic violence, separation from parent(s), gang violence, and abuse. Our licensed therapists are well equipped to assist children impacted by divorce, bullying and other social hardships.

Child Link treats individuals experiencing interpersonal conflicts at home, school, work or in the community. Child Link's work within the community provides services that extend beyond clinical work, enabling us to offer referrals for crisis intervention.

We provide tailored integrative clinical services that are as individualized as the people we treat. These treatments include: Trauma Informed Treatment, Psychodynamic Therapy, Dialectical Behavior Therapy, and Cognitive Behavioral Therapy.



Each course of treatment is based on collaborative treatment plans that are tailored to individual needs.






CHILD LINK BY THE NUMBERS

In 2022, Child Link's revenue was \$9.6 million and of that, \$8.6 million went to our programs and services that helped improve the lives of 440 children and young adults in our care. Child Link offers bilingual foster care services, for the many Spanish-speaking children and families that we serve. Our staff works hard to place Spanish speaking or bilingual children into foster homes that reflect their communication needs.

Child Link is a member of the Latino Consortium, where we partner with other child welfare agencies to organize resources and support for Latino families in Chicago and throughout Illinois. Allowing families to participate in bilingual programs is an essential component to ensuring those in our care are prepared for success.

WORKFORCE DIVERSITY

Promoting an atmosphere of inclusion and diversity is an utmost priority for Child Link's continued success. Out workforce reflects perspectives, backgrounds and experiences that enhance our vision and goals, and strengths the quality of our services.
